**Minutes of the Annual Meeting,  
St. Hugh Episcopal Church,  
Sunday January 23, 2011**

The Annual Meeting took place in the midst of our Eucharistic celebration. The Rev. Christie Logan was celebrant. Our liturgy began with the welcoming of new members: Russ and Lois Sweany and Beth and Jeff Leedy. Following the Gospel, the business meeting was held.

The following resolution was passed by acclamation: That the parish will approve the formation of an administration committee composed of the wardens, the treasurer and/or a member of the finance committee, a clergy member and a member at large. This committee is responsible for approving all building and grounds work, and is given authority to sign any approved contracts.

Linda Niles presented the 2011 budget and it was approved by acclamation.

Permission was granted to the Diocese of Olympia to market and sell “Lot 1” to satisfy the \$40,000 Mission Development Loan.

Cliff Cotey presented the possibility of starting a community garden at the back end of the parking lot. The project was approved pending the formation of a committee to oversee the project and deal with all the details.

The Rev. Robin Moore gave a brief history of Total Common Ministry at St. Hugh and introduced two members of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Circle for formation. Vicki Betsinger, call to the Priesthood, and Sheri Simpson, called to the ministry support circle both shared their experiences in the circle and invited the congregation to participate in the classes that are offered.

Our liturgy continued with the Liturgy of the Table, and was followed by breakfast enjoyed by all.
